Glazing is a nationally recognized trade under the Inter-provincial Red Seal Program. That means you become qualified to work anywhere in Canada.

What is a Glazier?

A Glazier is a construction trades person who selects, cuts, installs, replaces, and removes automotive, residential, and commercial glass. Glaziers also install aluminum storefront frames and entrances, glass handrails and shower enclosures, curtain wall framing and glass, and mirror walls.

An apprentice glazier can work on both commercial job sites and residential ones. It takes approximately four years for an apprentice to complete the on-the-job training and schooling. After filling qualifications, an apprentice becomes a Journeyman Glazier and is qualified for work on commercial and industrial glazing jobs.

Qualifications/Requirements:

- Applicants must have a copy of their High School Diploma or GED.
- Applicants must be in good health and physically able to perform all phases of the work.
- Applicants must be able to read, write and speak the English language in order to comprehend instructions on the job and in related training classes, and to ensure personal and co-worker safety on the job.
- Applicants must complete all related application forms.
- Applicants must possess a valid drivers license.

Application Process:
